Key functions of ORSE

- Establishment and monitoring of tariffs
- Monitor and ensure compliance with laws, regulations, and contract conditions
- Review of delegation contracts and license applications and provision of recommendations for issuance;
- Protection of customer interests
- Promotion of competition and industry participation.

Note: Limited regulation of sanitation

Regulation of sanitation services in the Republic of Congo is very limited. There is no defined regulator; the Ministry of Energy and Hydraulics, Ministry of Environment, Ministry of Health share general control of the sector. The ministry of Urban Development and Housing is also involved in regulating sanitation through urban planning and land use.
