Regulation of WSS services in Gabon is developed mainly for urban water supply services provided by "Société d'Energie et d'Eau du Gabon (SEEG)". The Ministry of Energy and Hydraulic Resources (MEH) ensures technical regulation by entering into contract with SEEG and ARSEE ensures the compliance with laws and contract provisions as well as other economic regulatory responsibilities. Rural water is loosely regulated by the Directorate of Rural Hydraulics while regulatory framework for sanitation is under development by the Directorate of Sanitation; both directorates are within MEH (<u>Ref</u>)
