Regulation by agency is the predominant WSS Regulatory form in Gambia and is limited to urban water supply and sewerage services provided by the National Water Supply and Electricity Company (NAWEC) and regulated by The Public Utilities Regulatory Authority (PURA).

The Ministry of Fisheries and Water Resources (MFWR) through its Department of Water Resources is responsible for developing rural water supply infrastructure and provides technical support to community-level water committees that are responsible for operation and maintenance (O&M).

Regulation of both urban and rural sanitation is very limited. The Ministry of Health sets standards, conducts limited enforcement in urban areas, and leads monitoring of rural sanitation under the country's Community-Led Total Sanitation (CLTS) programme.
