Key functions of LEWA

- Issuing of licences
- Setting minimum levels of service
- assessing the performance of the regulated entities;
- Reviewing the prices of services;
- Protecting the interests of consumers
- Ensuring the security of supply of urban water and sewerage services
- Resolving customer complaints

Note: Regulation of rural water supply and sanitation

In Lesotho, water supply and sanitation services are provided by two main service providers. These are WASCO responsible for urban water supply and sanitation and regulated by LEWA and the Department of Rural Water and Sanitation (DRWS) which is responsible for infrastructure development as well as water and sanitation service delivery focusing on rural areas however, in practice, WSS services are mainly provided by local authorities and regional councils and remain largely unregulated.
